

* Something Special Close to Home *

Stay safe. Stay close to home. That's the message we all hear. COVID-19 has put a damper on vacation opportunities this year. And, with that in mind the Historical Society of Phillipston would like to remind you of an interesting hike with exceptional building remains with granite foundations that are right in town.



Goulding village, located at the corner of Barre Road and Riley Switch Road, was a thriving industrial complex in the early 1800's. There was a cotton mill there, a woolen mill, a hat factory, a chair shop, and a creamery where first-grade butter was churned, and all of these businesses were powered by water from Queen Lake. You can check out page 16 in <u>The Spirit of Phillipston</u> book to see one of the buildings that was there.


When steam engines replaced water power and the railroad bypassed Phillipston, industry moved away. People also moved away... but the change kept our town from possibly becoming a city.

However, the incredible remains of the high rock and granite walls built by hand to hold the water needed to power the mills and the massive granite structures built to house the waterwheels are still there. You have to see the stone works to believe we have such a treasure.

The property was donated to the Historical Society by *Patience + Werner Bundschuh* in 2013 for all to enjoy and appreciate. Eagle Scout Andrew Flynn created a pathway through the complex in 2014 to make it accessible and to lead the way to the important remains. A woodland walk through this tucked-away historic site is an eye-opening experience for people of all ages; an interesting, safe place to enjoy that is close to home.

Eligibility

Any registered voter may use this application to request a mail-in ballot for any election being held in 2020.

Completing the Application

- Voter Information Provide your name, the address where you are registered to vote, and date of birth. Telephone number and e-mail address are optional.
- Ballot Information Choose which election(s) in which you want to vote by mail. If you are voting by mail in the State Primary and you are Unenrolled (Independent), choose one party ballot. Also provide the address where you want the ballots mailed.
- 3. Assistance If you are assisting a voter in completing this application, complete this section.
- Sign your name If you require assistance in signing the application, you may authorize someone to sign your name in your presence. That person must complete the assisting person's information in Section 3.

Submitting the Application

Send the completed application to the local election official at your city or town hall.

Find contact information for local election officials at www.sec.state.ma.us/ele or by calling 1-800-462-VOTE (8683).

Applications can be mailed or hand-delivered. Applications may also be submitted electronically by fax or e-mail, as long as your signature is visible.

If you're applying for a State Primary ballot, this application must arrive at your local election office by August 26. For November 3 State Election ballots, the application must arrive by October 28.
