

Dear Friends,

I recently read the book <u>The True Story of Peter Rabbit, How a Letter from Beatrix Potter</u> <u>Became a Children's Classic</u>, by Jane Johnson. The story is about Beatrix Potter's friendship with the Moore family, especially the eldest child Noel. Beatrix visited the family with her mice and rabbit named Peter. One summer day, Miss Potter had to leave them and go to Scotland, but she promised to write. After she left Noel became very ill, and had to stay in bed for months. That autumn a plump envelope came for Noel. But instead of news, there was a story with pictures about Peter Rabbit. Noel adored the story about the adventures of the rabbit hero. He soon memorized the story. Later his mother encouraged Beatrix Potter to make the letter into a book.

Apparently, Noel Moore was a real five year old boy who lived in London in 1893 when Miss Potter wrote her story for him. With childhood intuition, he realized that he was the true hero of the story. Later he became ill again, with polio and afterwards walked with a limp. This was of course, before a vaccine, can you imagine?

Noel grew up to be a priest, ministering to children in the slums of London. We still love the Beatrix Potter stories, but need to remember that this young woman would never have written the stories if she had not once known and understood a little boy who needed her. She had empathy and compassion for him, she was able to put herself in his shoes, and write him a beautiful comforting story. Isn't that what God did for us, sent his son, Jesus Christ, God with us, to understand and have compassion on us? We will celebrate his birthday on Christmas Eve, with a worship service at 4:00 in the afternoon, weather permitting outside on the Common!


