Waste Reduction Options:

Non-Residents accepted at Athol Transfer & Recycling Center's CHARM

Phillipston Transfer Station sells 2-year trash and recycling stickers for only \$40. To complement our transfer station, Athol Transfer & Recycling Center is open to non-residents. Like Phillipston, Athol is a CHARM (Center for Hard-to-Recycle Materials) but also accepts car batteries, fire extinguishers, propane tanks, refrigerators, and freezers. Food scraps (veggies, meat, bones, dairy) and shredded paper/paper products are accepted for compost. Fee-based bulky items are accepted for disposal year-round.
