

Dear Friends,

The Sunday before Thanksgiving (November 22) has always been my favorite Sunday in the Phillipston Church. On that Sunday the congregation brings forward fruit and vegetables to the front of the church and hands the fruit and vegetables to the Flower committee members. Every year, I see the people come forward with their butternut squash, potatoes and onions, and I think this is not going to be a very pretty arrangement. I am astonished to see how beautiful the arrangement becomes in Alice Cowlbeck's wooden trencher (bowl). Someone brings forward a Hubbard squash, and some apples, some carrots, and all of a sudden the wooden trencher looks incredible. It is incredible because it if filled with fruit and vegetables of many different colors, but more important than how aesthetically pleasing the vegetable arrangement appears, it is really about caring and mission. The fruit and vegetables are taken to different families afterwards, sometimes as many as three families have received, because after all the pears, bananas, cranberries and grapes are added to the squash, potatoes and onions, there is an enormous amount of food present.

This is a wonderful long standing tradition in the Phillipston Church. I love it every year. This year with social distancing, and masks we are in the sanctuary, and I believe we will still fill Alice's wooden trencher, with delicious food. Feel free to also bring paper and canned goods, if you prefer, on Sunday, November 22 at 10:00 a.m.
